

**british imperial trans-antarctic expedition 1914 (december ...** - british imperial trans-antarctic expedition sir ernest Shackleton, his Weddell Sea party and crew arrived on 5 November 1914 aboard *Endurance* (built at Framn's shipyard in Sandefjord, Norway; completed 17 December 1912). The expedition set sail on 5 December 1914, heading south for the ice and the Antarctic continent.

**antarctica - Lindblad expeditions** - the imperial trans-antarctic expedition centennial in 1914 Ernest Shackleton and a crew of 27 stalwart individuals attempted to undertake what Shackleton described as "the one remaining great object of Antarctic journeying" - crossing the continent on foot from the Weddell Sea to the Ross Sea via the South Pole.

**sir Ernest Shackleton and the Endurance expedition** - the imperial trans-antarctic expedition the *Endurance* set off from England just as the 1st World War was about to happen. Shackleton volunteered his ship and crew for the war effort but was told in a telegram to "proceed". It sailed in August 1914. 28 men including Shackleton were to reach the Antarctic.

**the imperial trans-antarctic expedition Dr Beau ...** - proposed an expedition to cross the continent from the Weddell Sea to McMurdo Sound, but he had been unable to attract the necessary funding. Three years later, when he published his small book *Antarctic Exploration*, Bruce was still extolling the value of such an expedition, and one explorer who agreed with him was the German Wilhelm Filchner.

**Shackleton's leadership of - the Citadel** - Shackleton, a veteran of Antarctic exploration who had been knighted for his earlier expeditions, felt that crossing Antarctica was "the last great polar journey that can be made." He named his endeavor the Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition. Shackleton and his men failed utterly at the expedition's stated goal; they never even set

**Endurance: the Antarctic legacy of Sir Ernest Shackleton ...** - the expedition was even called the Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition. Although Britain claimed most of Antarctica as part of their empire, a Belgian expedition was the first to successfully spend the winter there, and a Norwegian explorer, Roald Amundsen, was the first to the South Pole in 1911.

**Shackleton's last great Antarctic expedition** - Shackleton turned his attention to the last great Antarctic expedition "a journey across the continent via the South Pole." He began his Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition in 1914, just before the outbreak of the first World War. By January 1915, his ship the *Endurance* had become frozen on an ice floe.
