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suicide assessment - huntsville hospital system - suicide assessment about 31,000 people complete the act of suicide each year, an average of one person every 16 to 18 minutes. suicide is the eleventh leading cause of death in the united states. the actual number of suicides may be two to three times higher because of the underreporting that occurs. worldwide, at least 1000 suicides occur each day,

are previous suicide attempts a risk factor for completed ... - 800,000 people commit suicide every year, with the principal risk factors being suffering from a mental disorder (cavanagh, carson, sharpe, & lawrie, 2003) and having a history of prior suicide attempts (nock et al., 2008). that being said, there are many more people who make suicide attempts than people who complete them.

some facts about suicide and depression - dartmouth - the suicide risk among treated patients is 141/100,000 (isacson et al, 2000). about 2/3 of people who complete suicide are depressed at the time of their deaths. about 7 out of every hundred men and 1 out of every hundred women who have been diagnosed with depression in their lifetime will go on to complete suicide.
