independent uses of the subjunctive mood - independent uses of the subjunctive mood general: latin has three moods or *œmanners of verbal action*. the indicative mood is used for statements of fact and questions. the imperative mood expresses a command. the subjunctive is used to express idea, intent, desire, uncertainty, potentiality, or anticipation.

the subjunctive mood: summary of forms and clause types - latin employs the subjunctive much more frequently than english, in a wide variety of clause types, and it uses special subjunctive verb forms rather than auxiliaries. there are two tasks involved in mastering the subjunctive: first, learning the new forms, which is a relatively simple matter;

uses of the subjunctive mood - bible greek vpod - uses of the subjunctive mood the subjunctive is the mood of possibility or potentiality, expressing the action as uncertain, but probable. the word subjunctive comes to the english from the latin *subiungere* meaning *œto join on, attach, subdue*.

the subjunctive (part 2) 59.1 the subjunctive uses of ... - the subjunctive is usually used when there is an element of doubt about something. the main uses of the subjunctive are 1. future conditions (we don't know if the conditions will be fulfilled). introduced by *œ* (*œ* + *œ*) with the subjunctive in the protasis (the "if" clause). the apodosis (the "then" clause) uses the indicative.

desired (optative) or as possible (potential). i. volitive: there are five types of volitive subjunctives, and they all imply authority on the part of the speaker:

ut clauses of purpose, result and indirect command - for each of these constructions, latin uses a subordinate clause introduced by ut with the verb of the subordinate clause in the subjunctive mood. i. ut clauses of purpose: a purpose clause is preceded by ut (in order that) with the verb in the subjunctive.!! venit ut eam videat. he comes in order that he might see her (ÄÏÄÏœto see herÄÏÄÏ•).
