**metaphor - examples and definition of metaphor** - metaphor definition. a metaphor is a figure of speech that makes an implicit, implied, or hidden comparison between two things that are unrelated, but which share some common characteristics. in other words, a resemblance of two contradictory or different objects is made based on a single or some common characteristics.
